



UMPTEN F-BODIES AT GAA CLASSICS' MARCH SALE

GAA Classics, in Greensboro, North Carolina, knows that by the beginning of March everyone is good and ready for spring. Sensibly, then, they've tracked down a whole passel of muscle machines for their sale scheduled for March 2-4, 2017, giving buyers an instant cure for cabin fever.

While the offerings range from a resto-modded '55 Chevy hardtop, to a '63 Plymouth Savoy with a 426 Max Wedge and a four-speed, and an '09 Challenger that appears to be an unused Drag Pak car, what really caught our eye was the large number of second-generation Camaros and Firebirds that will be available.

Oldest of the second-gen cars is a 1970 Z28 RS, green inside and out, with a four-speed manual transmission. The 1970 is said to boast matching numbers and include original documentation.

A Burnt Orange '71 Z28, with a white interior and also hosting a four-speed, will be available as well, alongside a pair of '73s—one brown with a tan gut, the other burgundy with a black interior. The burgundy car is equipped with an automatic transmission and air conditioning.

The newest Camaros among the several second-gens are a pair of 1980 models, both Z28s and both equipped with four-speed transmissions and 350-cu.in. V-8 engines—one black and one white. These Camaros are joined by their Pontiac cousin, a 1978 Trans Am painted in the iconic black-and-gold with a red interior. The Trans Am is also a four-speed car.

AMELIA ISLAND

Amelia Island is undoubtedly one of the nation's premiere automotive destinations during the week of its concours d'elegance. It's no surprise, then, that four auction houses will be holding auctions there this month: RM Sotheby's, Motostalgia, Gooding & Company and Bonhams.

As of this writing, Bonhams, which takes its turn first on March 9th, had yet to list anything in the traditional muscle segment, though an earlier era of American performance is offered in the form of a 1908 American Underslung Roadster and a 1932 Stutz DV-32 Super Bearcat.

Also as of press time, Gooding had not yet announced its lots for Amelia Island, and though last year's offerings skew more toward classics and foreign cars, it is still worth watching the high-end muscle cars that cross the auction block. The Gooding sale will take place March 10th.

Motostalgia, scheduled for March 11th, has a similar emphasis to Gooding, though a Hemi-powered 1971 Dodge Challenger on offer that has a distinct NASCAR vibe will likely interest many readers of this magazine.

Lastly, RM Sotheby's, also set for March 11th, offers some proto-muscle in the form of a supercharged 1930 Stutz Model M coupe with a body by Lancefield.
